
Referring to a public specialist clinic in Victoria?

Statewide referral criteria is now in effect for selected conditions in three specialties.

From **1 November 2019** this will apply to the following conditions:







Check the DHHS Statewide Referral Criteria



Ear, nose and throat (ENT)

- Acute nasal fracture
- Bilateral or asymmetrical hearing loss
- Discharging ear
- Dysphagia
- Hoarse voice (dysphonia)
- Neck mass or lumps
- Obstructive sleep apnoea

Urology

- Haematuria
- Lower urinary tract symptoms
- Prostate cancer (suspected or confirmed)
- Recurrent, uncomplicated urinary tract infection

Vascular

- Aortic aneurysm
- Carotid artery disease
- Deep vein thrombosis
- High-risk foot ulcers

- Recurrent tonsilitis
- Rhinosinusitis
- Salivary gland disorder or mass

- Thyroid mass
- Tinnitus
- Vertigo (ENT)
- Renal mass
- Renal tract stones or renal colic
- Scrotal abnormalities
- Urinary incontinence
- Hyperhidrosis
- Lymphoedema
- Non-healing or chronic lower leg ulcers
- Varicose veins
