





PRINCIPLE 1: SYSTEM PROCESSES

- ▶ PPE
- Workspace and equipment
- Education and staff training
- Responsibility and accountability

PRINCIPLE 2: ENVIRONMENT

 Decontamination area – Instrument cleaning

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- How many sinks do you have? Do you need to purchase containers to complete a safe process?
- Is your clean area away from the risk of re-contamination?








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PRINCIPLE 3: WORKFLOW

- Reprocessing should follow one direction (e.g. left to right)
- Functionality of workspace
- Identify any inefficiencies in the reprocessing steps



PROCESS

- Start of the shift checks
- Allocated & protected times
- Processing

- Loading the steriliser
- Unloading the steriliser
- End of the day checks
