2. STI Community of Practice - DoxyPeP

Short news item

Join our statewide STI community of practice

This is an opportunity for GPs and nurses interested in deepening their understanding of STIs to meet experts, discuss complex cases, ask questions, seek advice, and provide peer support.

DoxyPEP involves taking an antibiotic after a high-risk sexual act to reduce the risk of bacterial sexually transmitted infections among gay, bisexual, and other men who have sex with men. Clinical trials of DoxyPEP have shown significant reductions in syphilis, chlamydia and gonorrhoea.

This session will provide attendees with an update on Doxy-PEP and how to determine whether this might be a suitable strategy for your patients. Dr Melanie Bissessor, sexual health physician and Shauna Hall, nurse practitioner at Melbourne Sexual Health Centre, will facilitate the session online on Tuesday, 29 April.
